If you missed this luncheon you missed a real fun time.


Brandon Kennedy played and sang

Forever stamps - Get more now

The U.S. Postal Service will raise the price of a first-class Forever stamp by 5 cents, from 68 cents to 73 cents, on July 14, 2024. Those stamps cover the cost to mail a 1-ounce letter; the cost of an additional ounce will rise from 24 cents to 28 cents.

Metered letters will be 64 cents, up from 69 cents. Postcards will costs a bit more. Domestic postcards will cost three cents more, rising to 56 cents from 53 cents. You'll pay a dime extra for outbound international letters: They will cost \$1.65, up from \$1.55.

How to Decode the Colorful Tags on Your Bread Bag

"Bread buckles" and "bread tabs," tell grocery store shoppers when the bread was baked and packaged while helping to keep things organized for the staff who stock the shelves as well. Although some shops use their own methods, and it's rare to find bread more than a couple of days old still on the shelves, most grocery stores follow a similar schedule with their bread tag coloring as detailed below:

Monday – Blue

Tuesday - Green

Thursday - Red

Friday – White

Saturday - Yellow

Most bakeries don't produce bread on Sundays and Wednesdays. To help us remember the nifty key, the days of the week match the colors when listed alphabetically. So, since "blue" starts with 'b' and is close to the start of the alphabet, it corresponds to Monday.

That means if you go to the grocery store on a Friday, you'll want to choose a loaf with a white or red bread tag to ensure the freshest bread. Don't forget the other important tool you can check as well- the expiration date.
